I know that not being able to hear the speaker is extremely frustrating. Suggestions that might help include switch your hearing aid to the 'T' position [if it has one] at the beginning of the meeting, sit nearer the front -there are always spaces free on the front row and finally tell the speaker you can't hear them so that they speak louder or more slowly. It is very difficult when using a microphone to gauge where to pitch your voice so that you are heard without shouting.

WALKING GROUP

Thursday 17th November 8.75 miles – 08:30 prompt start from Wharf Lane car park or at approx 09:45 at the High Peak Junction Car park (SK 314 560). The car park is Pay-and-Display and the charge is likely to be £4.40 per car. Please let the Walk Leader know if you intend going direct to High Peak Junction and provide a mobile number. This walk was created after a request was made for a hilly walk and this is my version of the Three Peak Challenge, albeit on a smaller scale. This is a strenuous walk with approx 425 metres (1394 feet) of ascent over three hills. Starting at the Junction we will head off to Cromford then to Lea and Holloway before returning to the Junction. Walking is mainly on footpaths and rights of way with a small amount of roadside walking. During the walk we will pass through several wooded areas and across fields, which can be uneven underfoot. Please wear good, ankle supporting walking boots, as it is likely to be wet and slippery underfoot.
