GEOLOGY & ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES GROUP

Our last meeting, on Tuesday 13th June, attended by 24 members, comprised a visit to the newly installed "Green Energy" anaerobic digester plant near the A46 at Cropwell Bishop. This plant produces methane rich Biogas in the three large green vats, from a feed of both farmed crops such as silage and maize, and biological waste such as turkey manure. This feed with additional warm water and seeded with certain bacteria undergoes chemical reactions which break down the biological fraction by stages releasing large volumes of methane (CH4) and carbon dioxide (CO2). The cleaned gas produced then fuels two large generators with a total electrical output of 1 megawatt which is fed into the national grid. The solids remaining (digestate) are separated and returned to the fields as fertilizer. We therefor learnt that the presence of the plant serves both as a producer of Green Energy and a useful agricultural byprod-
