Welcome to December; this has been another eventful month since I last wrote to you all. What had felt inevitable for some time finally came to me, one week into November, when I tested positive for COVID-19. I hadn't been out there looking for it and don't really know where I contacted it, but fortunately it felt like, and has played out like, a moderately bad cold. Needless to say my husband John tested positive 3 days later, but as he had been avoiding mixing with people after I had tested positive, we don't think he has passed it on and I hope I only passed it to John.

So what have I learned from this that is relevant to our u3a? The most important thing for me is that we keep registers of attendance at u3a activities (I believe all our group leaders are great at this), but more importantly we tell our group leader if we test positive in the days following a u3a activity. Our group leaders can with your permission let other group members know that 'someone' (no need for names) has tested positive and we can also do this for our monthly meetings. The one thing 'Track & Trace' will not do, despite the money spent on it, is inform the people you were with after you test positive. They will tell your close contacts only if you tell 'Track & Trace' the names and contact details of all your close contacts; which quite honestly if you know them that well, you would probably do that yourself! The best you can hope for from 'Track & Trace' is the 'ping' on your phone (assuming people are still using it) which, might be too little too late, if my experience of it back in October is anything to go by.

I hope that you enjoy this month's newsletter and that you are also able to enjoy the festive season in whichever way you choose. It has undoubtedly been another difficult year, but at least we are ending it with a more active u3a than this time last year. So I am going to raise a glass to that.

Various themes related to the geology of Nottinghamshire were presented for discussion two of which were the following: a) the extent of coal mining, when over 40 collieries had been active of which none remain so; b) The fact that Britain's first productive oil field was discovered at Eakring central Notts in 1939 and with heip of equipment and rough necks shipped secretly from the USA, extracted millions of barrels of crude oil which probably helped swing the air war in our favour.
