#### **COMMUNITY MINI-BUS**

The Radcliffe on Trent u3a have renewed and obtained the special Section 19 Permit which enables its members to hire a private mini-bus to make trips to places of interest or to visit events.

This is not the same as hiring a coach with driver from a bus company.

The u3a have to ensure the mini-bus used is maintained, that insurance is available and find a driver as well as organise destination and admissions if required.
