TRIPS & OUTINGS - PLANS FOR 2025

By the time you read this it is likely that our Christmas Lunch at Morley Hayes GC will have sold out but you can still put your name down in case of any cancellations.

At our recent committee meeting we started to lay down plans for next year. With full details to be made available in January 2025, here are some ideas of what we have decided at this time.

In April we plan to visit Bletchley Hall, on Tuesday 15th . Bletchley is world famous for De-Coding the Germans Codes, including the less well known but as important 'Fish' changed to 'Tunny' at Bletchley and the more famous Enigma machine. They also developed Colossus, the first large-scale electronic computer, which went into operation in 1944. The cost is anticipated to be £36 pp incl. Coach and Entry to Bletchley Hall.

On Wednesday 14th May we will visit Bradford, as it celebrates being the City of Culture in 2025. We plan to visit the Science and Media Museum followed by either the Industrial or the Peace museum. Plans will be confirmed when we know what date the Science and Media Museum reopens in 2025, following a massive refurbishment. Anticipated cost will be £26 this will include a £10 Food Voucher

On Tuesday June 10th we will visit Cambridge on a Coach only basis, giving our members a freestyle visit. We will send, prior to the visit, via email comprehensive information on the attractions. One suggestion highly recommended is the Botanical Gardens a 15 minute walk from the town centre. Anticipated cost £18 pp

In July, we will once again consider visiting the Kilworth Outdoor Theatre, but are waiting for confirmation of the production they will be putting on, before we commit.

In September we will arrange a visit to Salford Quays and the Lowry Museum. We will also visit the BBC Studios, costings to follow nearer the time.

GEOLOGY and ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES GROUP.

Our last meeting, on 12th November, attended by 28 members, was a talk by Greg Chapman on the early days of Dinosaur fossil recognition and classification, much of which was carried out by British academics in the early 19th century at localities in England such as Dorset, the Isle of Wight and the Weald.

In the second half of the century, in the American Wild West, very large numbers of complete Dinosaur skeletons were found which led to fierce competition between different groups and some very dubious practices.

Later in his talk Greg spoke of the sudden extinction of most Dinosaur species probably resulting from a massive asteroid impact south of the Gulf of Mexico.

Our next meeting is on Tuesday 10th December, starting at 2pm again in the Grange Hall Trent Room when we plan a discussion of the past years program, coupled with a informal quiz based on rock and mineral specimens and illustrations, One of which is included here - do you know what the near vertical rock features are?

As this event will be accompanied by seasonal wine, mince pies and coffee, It would be helpful to know how many might attend so please act accordingly!


