#### **CHURCH VISITING GROUP**

The initial aim of this group was to visit six different Parish Churches between April and September. However, during last winter and this winter other visits of interest have been organised as well. Nineteen of us opted to visit Taylor's Bell Foundry in Loughborough.

This is now the only Bell Foundry remaining in England and the World largest Bell Foundry. Since 1859 it has provided 25,000 bells for 100 different countries. Significant bells produced by Taylor's in England include nearly every Cathedral and thousands of Parish Churches. On entering the foundry it was like stepping back into Victorian times. We learnt how the bells were cast, tuned, hung and transported. Whilst we went as a group, maximum size 20, it is possible to join other groups should you be interested. However, we do recommend that you delay your visit till next Spring when the renovations and new museum should be ready.

We plan to visit a Quaker Friends meeting house in the New Year to learn about activities, beliefs and the culture of the Quakers.
