## A VISIT TO THE AIR RAID SHELTER WEST BRIDGFORD



It was a tight fit when 24 of our members squeezed into the recently renovated and re-opened (for history purposes only!) the World War II Air Raid Shelter on Abbey Circus in West Bridgford.

This is one of just two such Shelters that survive in West Bridgford and has been rescued by a team led by Professor Chris Reynolds of Nottingham Trent University, ably assisted by Jason King a retired secondary school teacher and an inveterate collector of second World War artefacts – tin helmets, stirrup pumps, gas masks and the like. Originally intended as a living lesson on the history of wartime

Nottingham for school children it has proven doubly interesting for members of our u3a some of whom can actually remember the shelter or others like it being built in 1939 (I'm too young at just 79 years old!)

The visit also included a short film produced by students at Nottingham Trent University showing how the visiting children were able learn about the war and to re-enact the aftereffects of an air raid acting as Air Raid Wardens and so on.

### Dates for your 2026 Diary

#### **Tuesday April 21<sup>st</sup> - Lichfield and the Staffordshire Regiment Museum - £25 pp**

We will visit the Regimental Museum before taking the short trip to Lichfield where we will have free time to explore the city. Places of interest are the Cathedral, The Old Guildhall Prison and Lichfield's first Social Enterprise Coffee Shop, The Hub, which is a colourful new space in the heart of the city, located at St Mary's on Market Square. Visit the Stunning Georgian home of Erasmus Darwin, grandfather of Charles Darwin and leading 18th century doctor, scientist, botanist, inventor and poet. There are also many interesting buildings, shops, cafés and Pubs to explore.

#### **Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> May - Coventry Cathedral and the Transport Museum - £28-00 pp**

We will visit the Transport museum which explores the growth of manufacturing of transport related items in the Midlands and it has the largest collection of British manufactured vehicles. We will then have free time to visit the Modern Cathedral and the old town that survived the Blitz in WW 2. There are many other interesting places to explore all within walking distance, including Sgt. Bilko's Vintage Emporium, specialising in vintage & modern TV, Film and Stage memorabilia. Bilko was memorably played by Phil Silvers, in his 60's TV show.

#### **Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> June - Liverpool - £20 pp**

This will be a coach only visit where we will drop you off by the Albert Dock and you will have plenty of free time to visit many of the interesting opportunities within a short walking distance of the dock.

#### **Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> July - Kilworth Outdoor Theatre - £60 pp**

We will visit Palmers Garden Centre en-route to Kilworth where you will be able to enjoy the shopping and have a coffee in the café. We will then drive to Kilworth to enjoy the musical 'Anything Goes' featuring great songs by Cole Porter such as 'I get a kick out of you' 'Friendship' & 'You're the Tops' along with the title song, all supported by the wonderful singers & dancers from Kilworth.

#### **Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup> September - National Coal Museum & Sculpture Park - Cost TBC**

At the Coal Museum there will be the opportunity to go underground at an additional cost, this to be booked when confirming your booking for the trip. The Sculpture Park is a short distance away with the sculptures set outside, within the 500-acre park. They have a planned walk that will take about 1-30hrs and is the best way to view all the works.

# AVIATION GROUP The Schneider Trophy Air Races

Our speaker will be Brian Fernley, who will talk to us about the Schneider Trophy Air Races were seaplane races held initially to encourage technical advances in civil aviation but became a contest for pure speed. The race was held twelve times between 1913 and 1931, the year when it was finally won permanently by the British.

The races were significant in advancing aeroplane design and were instrumental in developing the best fighters of World War II, most famously the Spitfire.
