'The ongoing war in Ukraine against the illegal Russian invasion has focused a great deal of media and public interest on the role being played on both sides by the huge number of tactical and strategic drones.'

## St Pancras: The "Railway Cathedral" Comes Back to Life

We had a fantastic session on January 8th with **historian Nigel Lowey**, who took us behind the scenes of the incredible transformation of St Pancras Station. Nigel kicked things off by explaining how this "cathedral-like" building was born in the Victorian era. It was not just a station; it was a statement. He highlighted the mix of George Gilbert Scott's stunning Gothic architecture (that iconic red brick made in Mapperley!) and

William Barlow's engineering genius—creating the world's largest single-span roof at the time.

The Great Escape – It's hard to believe now, but this building was once a "long-neglected" mess. Nigel shared the "great story" of how it narrowly escaped the wrecking ball in the 1960s. After years of decay, it finally got the makeover it deserved, turning a crumbling landmark into a breathtaking international hub.



Whether you're a history buff or just love a good comeback story, Nigel's talk was a brilliant reminder of how elegant engineering can stand the test of time. Huge thanks to Nigel for sharing his expertise with us!
